2. OPIS PREDMETA				
1.1. Ciljevi predmeta (najviše: 200 riječi)	The course <i>Political Ideas and Ideologies</i> offers a comprehensive examination of modern political ideologies. This examination consists of three parts. First, through understanding of the history of the concept of ideology from the French Revolution to present day. Second, by investigating different approaches and methods of studying and researching ideology. Last, by giving a broad overview of the development of major modern ideological currents with an emphasis on the second part of 20 <sup>th</sup> century to today. In seminars the students will have a chance to discuss political ideas such as liberty, utopia, toleration, truth, power, legitimacy, and justice within a wider framework of different ideologies. Apart from reading key thinkers, we will look at the transformation of these ideas and ideologies through their use by political parties and movements, as well as in art (literature, music, visual arts).
